Oscar Isaac plays Victor Frankenstein, a brilliant scientist tortured by ambition and his own raging passions. Pushing his work beyond scientific certainty to the boundary between life and death, he brings a new being into existence in a spectacular moment of creation. Played in completely original fashion by Jacob Elordi, Frankenstein's monster begins as a powerful, dangerous beast but carries the equally dangerous capacity to learn from human behaviour. It puts both Frankenstein and his fiancé Elizabeth (Mia Goth) in jeopardy. Having spent most of his life absorbing and distilling the Frankenstein story and all its lore, del Toro (*Pan's Labyrinth, Shape of Water*) takes liberties with the novel. The result is a singular vision that could only have come from cinema's master of the monstrous.

Capel Green is a feature length documentary film which focuses on the life of Larry Warren, original witness and whistle-blower in the famous Rendlesham Forest Incidents. An insightful and human story about his fight for truth regarding what actually took place in the early hours of Sunday December 28th 1980 in a farmer's field which sits on the edge of the forest. Described as Britain's "Roswell", the mysterious lights and events witnessed by many US Air Force personnel, spanned three evenings; and the Capel Green incident on the third night of activity was by far the most intriguing. A cold case from almost four decades ago, the film follows his life bringing forward new evidence and previously unseen original documents. Larry has fought for the justice and truth behind this matter since that night; battling the press, the military unit he served, as well as a few online detractors. The film talks to the many witnesses involved, some whom have never spoken on camera ever, and takes the time to analyse the facts, documents and evidence behind what really occurred, and questions why these incidents did not follow the standard investigation procedures by authorities.



John Cleese Packs it In (15) UK 2025. Dir Andy Curd. With John Cleese - 90mins


One of the most recognisable figures in British comedy, John Cleese's career spans six decades from his early days with the Cambridge Footlights to co-founding Monty Python, co-creating Fawlty Towers, and writing and starring in the Oscar-nominated "A Fish Called Wanda". His unique brand of black humour has made him a global icon and intergalactic treasure.

At the age of eighty five, John Cleese sets off on what might be his final European tour - five countries, sixteen cities, twenty-three shows, and retaining just two original body parts. "John Cleese Packs It In" is a wry, behind-the-scenes portrait of a comedy legend on the road, battling various ailments, chaotic travel, and his own stubborn refusal to stop.

Spanning six weeks on the road, the film captures Cleese unfiltered and on the move - riffing on life, fame, and the absurdity of getting old in front of thousands of fans. As he reflects on a stage career that began in 1963, the question lingers: is this the end of the road?

A season of films showcasing the history of Technicolor filmmaking, taking us around the world to the far reaches of its influence.

From wartime Britain to a German school of dance run by witches and all the way to the Bengal River, all in beautiful vivid colours.

These films present important snapshots in time of these cultures and show off the incredible filmmaking of these lauded directors and their crews.

Technicolor changed the course of cinema forever with bright and bold visuals, saturated to the point of near-surreality.

Technicolor is a series of processes used to first produce colour in motion pictures. From 1916 to 1932, the Technicolor company tinkered with its system so that the process of colouring films became accessible to Hollywood. Today, Technicolor is perhaps more known for the end result of the colouring process than the process itself.

By the early 1930's, Technicolor developed a brand-new camera, which utilised a three-colour system (otherwise known as three strip Technicolor) rather than a two-colour system. And instead of recording only one negative, this new camera recorded three. Each of the three negatives were responsible for either red, blue, or green. Once Technicolor caught on with Filmmakers and audiences, it became the gold standard for film colourisation for several decades. Even with its efforts to provide the best possible colour imagery, though, Technicolor was no longer in demand as technological advances in filmmaking rendered it obsolete by the mid-1970s, but its influence and importance live on to this day.

Honey & The Bear

Honey & the Bear have been a tour de force on the UK Folk Festival circuit in 2023. The British folk and roots. duo combine delicately interweaving vocal harmonies with emotive and evocative songwriting. SUFFOLK SHORTS









TICKET PRICES

General cinema entrance prices can be found at the front of the programme. Stage shows and live broadcast shows are priced individually. Please note pre-booked tickets for all our performances (including films) are non refundable. ID may be requested for 15 and 18 certificated films, and Student ID. There is a fee for purchasing tickets over the telephone, the Remote Booking Fee represents our charge for providing a convenient online and telephone booking service to our customers and is payable for all online and telephone bookings, irrespective of the method of payment. As the Remote Booking Fee only applies to bookings made online or by telephone, it can be avoided by purchasing tickets in person at the cinema. If you are an annual or six-monthly membership card holder then no booking fee is applicable online or via the telephone.

75p per ticket up to a maximum of £2.25, so if you purchase 4 tickets or more the total additional fee applicable would still be £2.25.

The fee allows a customer to secure a seat of their choice in advance, helps to cover the cost of our website, web hosting fees, our ticket provider costs, the processing of the payment and necessary administration to secure your advance booking.

AUDIO DESCRIPTION SERVICE

Cinema audio description is a fantastic service for people with sight loss. The normal film soundtrack comes through the cinema's surround sound speakers in the usual way, whilst a recorded narrator explains what's happening on screen – in gaps in the dialogue – through personal headphones. Most popular cinema releases are now available with audio description tracks.

Just ask for an A.D. headset at the box office. The audio description is broadcast through personal headphones – only the wearer hears it.

We also offer a hearing loop system for our customers with impaired hearing. A hearing loop sends sound from a source straight to hearing aids on the hearing loop setting (this used to be called the 'T' setting). Most hearing aids have a hearing loop setting.

CEA CARD

The CEA Card is a national card scheme developed for UK cinemas by the UK Cinema Association (UKCA). The Card enables a disabled cinema guest to receive a complimentary ticket for someone to go with them when they visit a participating cinema.
