USA 2025. Dir Darren Aronofsky. With Austin Butler, Zoe Kravitz, Matt Smith - 106mins

Hank Thompson (Austin Butler) was a high-school baseball phenom who can't play anymore, but everything else is going okay. He's got a great girl (Zoë Kravitz), tends bar at a New York dive, and his favorite team is making an underdog run at the pennant.

When his punk-rock neighbor Russ (Matt Smith) asks him to take care of his cat for a few days, Hank suddenly finds himself caught in the middle of a motley crew of threatening gangsters. They all want a piece of him; the problem is he has no idea why. As Hank attempts to evade their evertightening grip, he's got to use all his hustle to stay alive long enough to find out...

USA 2025. Dir Paul Thomas Anderson. With Leonardo DiCaprio, Sean Penn - 170mins

Few details have been made available regarding Anderson's highly anticipated drama. It is believed to be a loose adaptation of Thomas Pynchon's *Vineland* (the author behind Anderson's 2014 satire *Inherent Vice)*, and it features DiCaprio and an all-star cast in a tale about freedom fighters who resurface in US society to battle an old foe.

A House of Dynamite (15)

USA 2025. Dir Kathryn Bigelow. With Idris Elba, Rebecca Ferguson, Jared Harris - 112mins

At a remote military outpost, an unidentified incoming missile is detected, setting in motion an escalating series of actions and reactions across all levels of the United States government. With her trademark dynamic kineticism, Kathryn Bigelow (Strange Days, Point Break) puts the viewer in the centre of a crisis in which decisions must be made in limited time, based on incomplete and evolving information and untested protocols. Bigelow and screenwriter Noah Oppenheim construct a frighteningly plausible scenario in which a multitude of dilemmas—practical and personal, bureaucratic and existential—overlap in real time and at a mounting rate. The film's prismatic structure allows for a broad-scale thriller that entangles intimate dramas with an unfolding world-historic event.

I Swear (15)

UK 2025. Dir Kirk Jones. With Maxine Peake, Shirley Henderson, Peter Mullan - 120mins

Funny, heartfelt and emphatically moving, I Swear dramatises the true story of Tourette syndrome campaigner John Davidson and his quest to live normally in a world that insisted on calling him different.

Diagnosed aged 15, John's Tourette's made him the target of huge misunderstanding in 1980s Britain, and he faced hostility, bullying and occasionally outright violence for much of his youth. Aged 16, he was the subject of BBC TV documentary *John's Not Mad* (a Q.E.D. episode that's still ranked one of the 50 best British docs in national polls) and subsequently became one of the UK's most passionate advocates for greater awareness and acceptance of Tourette's, for which work he received an MBF in 2019.



Dead of Winter (15)

USA 2025. Dir Brian Kirk. With Emma Thompson, Judy Greer, Marc Menchaca - 97mins

A widowed fisherwoman (Emma Thompson), traveling alone through snowbound northern Minnesota, interrupts the kidnapping of a teenage girl (Laurel Marsden). Hours from the nearest town and with no phone service, she realizes that she is the young girl's only hope.

The *Dead of Winter* is a merciless kidnap thriller, set in the epic snowbound wilderness of northern Minnesota, with a beautiful love story at its heart.

Sam Riley delivers a career-best performance as a washed-up tennis coach caught up in a strange disappearance in this blisteringly hot noir thriller. A less-than-enthusiastic tennis coach for tourists at an all-inclusive resort in the Canary Islands, Tom spends his evenings drinking himself into abandon. Although his schedule is full for the week, he accepts the son of a sophisticated female guest and soon finds himself spending more time with the boy and his parents. But as peculiar tensions surface, Tom finds himself drawn deeper into their mysterious world. Ian-Ole Gerster's seductive, slow-burn thriller gradually ramps-up the tension, while Dascha Dauenhauer's moody score emphasises the film's fever-dream mood and hints at the unease that threatens Tom's world




Frankenstein

USA 2025. Dir Guillermo del Toro. With Oscar Isaac, Jacob Elordi, Mia Goth - 149mins

Oscar Isaac plays Victor Frankenstein, a brilliant scientist tortured by ambition and his own raging passions. Pushing his work beyond scientific certainty to the boundary between life and death, he brings a new being into existence in a spectacular moment of creation. Played in completely original fashion by Jacob Elordi, Frankenstein's monster begins as a powerful, dangerous beast but carries the equally dangerous capacity to learn from human behaviour. It puts both Frankenstein and his fiancé Elizabeth (Mia Goth) in jeopardy. Having spent most of his life absorbing and distilling the Frankenstein story and all its lore, del Toro takes liberties with the novel. The result is a singular vision that could only have come from cinema's master of the monstrous.

UK 1957. Dir Val Guest. With Brian Donlevy, John Longden, Sidney James - 85mins

Uncover a gripping tale of alien infiltration and Cold War paranoia in Hammer's chilling follow-up to their sci-fi breakthrough we recently screened.

When a series of meteorite showers fall near a topsecret government facility, Professor Bernard Quatermass is drawn into a mystery with terrifying implications. What begins as a scientific inquiry soon reveals a covert alien infiltration, spreading silently beneath the surface of official research. As the conspiracy unravels, Quatermass races against time to expose the truth—before an otherworldly force changes humanity forever. The film is based on Ken Kesey's best-selling novel published in 1962. Using the madhouse to symbolise the individual against the system, the story gets its power from its unforgettable ensemble of characters and accretion of details that reveal what life is about inside a mental institution. One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest swept the top five Oscars in 1976, the first film to do so since It Happened One Night in 1934.

The Titfield Thunderbolt (PG)


UK 1953. Dir Charles Crichton. With Stanley Holloway, George Relph, Naunton Wayne - 87mins

Mrs Warren's Profession (12A Live)

Broadcast live from the National Theatre - 120mins

Five-time Olivier Award winner Imelda Staunton (*The Crown*) joins forces with her real-life daughter Bessie Carter (*Bridgerton*) for the very first time, playing mother and daughter in Bernard Shaw's incendiary moral classic.

Vivie Warren is a woman ahead of her time. Her mother, however, is a product of that old patriarchal order. Exploiting it has earned Mrs. Warren a fortune – but at what cost?

Filmed live from the West End, this new production reunites Staunton with director Dominic Cooke (Follies, Good), exploring the clash between morality and independence, traditions and progress.

Too Much celebrates the visual excess and dramatic potency of a form of cinema which champions emotional intensity over propriety and 'good taste'. With roots in the exaggerated performance and expressive staging of the silent era, the melodramatic mode evolved to incorporate a wealth of genres and stories. United by their emotion-driven plots, vivid visual language and self-conscious audience manipulation, these films are designed to make you break down in tears, cause a scene, fall in love, feel something.

Defining melodrama is notoriously difficult – its trademarks (emotive music, dramatic plots and expressive performance) are the bread and butter of cinema.

Melodrama in film has long been associated with women – the rare storytelling mode concerned with their inner lives and everyday struggles. Women's pictures' employed melodrama to express longing, rage and desire in characters facing motherhood, infidelity, sexual abuse and scandal. Too Much will celebrate the female stars of melodrama who have drawn audiences to the cinema in their millions, and films exploring women's experiences are encouraged.



There's Always Tomorrow (PG)

USA 1956. Dir Douglas Sirk. With Barbara Stanwyck, Fred MacMurray, Joan Bennett - 81mins

Join us for this rare screening and opportunity to delve into Douglas Sirk's masterful melodrama *There's Always Tomorrow* that explores the suffocating confines of middle-class domesticity.

Centered on Fred MacMurray's deeply poignant portrayal of a husband and father who reconnects with an old flame (Barbara Stanwyck), the film examines the fleeting allure of escape and the crushing pull of societal expectations. This film's richly detailed mise-en-scene as Sirk's films elevate everyday objects—lamps, teacups, and furniture—to silent witnesses of emotional turmoil, amplifying the tension between characters and their environments.

The domestic items in *There's Always Tomorrow* become more than mere set dressing; it serves as a narrative agent, embodying the constraints of suburban life and the unspoken desires simmering beneath its surface.

The Regulars (18)

UK 2025 Dir Fil Freitas . With Fil Freitas, Sergio Barba, Lauren Shotton - 105mins

On the edge of Chinatown stands the only independent cinema left in Central London. Grey and black, dotted with poster frames, and lit by an overhanging readograph, its presence is tucked away from the other, brighter multiplexes of Leicester Square. There, within its small interior, a team of ushers push through the day.

Based on the real-life experiences and stories from those that work at the Prince Charles Cinema, Fil Freitas - a former usher turned manager himself - has put together a feature length comedy drama that follows a day in the life of its hapless employees. During their shift they watch movies, argue with customers, and above all, deal with each other.

Strange Journey: Rocky Horror (15) UK 2025 Dir Linus O'Brien. With Richard O'Brien, Tim Curry, Jack Black - 89mins

The son of *The Rocky Horror Picture Show* creator Richard O'Brien charts the journey of the sing-along cultural phenomenon.

Much like its protagonists, Brad and Janet, *The Rocky Horror Picture Show* has had a fantastical and surreal journey into the spotlight. It started life in an 85-seat studio space at London's Royal Court Theatre, before being adapted into a breakout cult movie that would become a midnight screening favourite, with a near-fanatical fanbase and a host of rituals, fanzines and spin-off events. Linus O'Brien's hugely entertaining directorial debut traces *Rocky Horror's* journey across the decades, highlighting why it has such staying power. Featuring interviews with creator Richard O'Brien, one of the film's stars, Tim Curry, and a host of artists, critics and fans, including Jack Black and Trixie Mattell, *Strange Journey* is a joyous testament to this 50-year-old classic.

Pressure (15) UK 1975. Dir Horace Ové. With Herbert Norville, Oscar James, Frank Singuineau - 120mins

With a screenplay written by Horace Ové and fellow Trinidadian author Sam Selvon, Pressure follows a Black family in west London; from the parents who came from Trinidad as part of the Windrush generation with their first son, now part of the Black Power Movement, to their younger British-born son Tony (Herbert Norville), who is trying to find his place between the two cultures. As he leaves school and encounters prejudice on individual and institutional levels, Tony struggles to find acceptance in the country he grew up in yet has no Caribbean home he can dream of returning to. Unemployed and caught between an aspirational mother and a radical older brother, he drifts away from school friends and towards Black Power politics.

A groundbreaking and authentic exploration of the anxieties of an emerging second-generation of West Indians in Britain, Pressure (1975) is a significant title in the history of British Cinema, and remains as relevant now, 50 years on, as it ever was — with its themes of police corruption, discrimination and employment on an individual and institutional level.





Music in Film Discussion + Quadrophenia (15)

UK 1979. Dir Franc Roddam. With Phil Daniels, Leslie Ash, Philip Davis - 120mins

We are delighted to be hosting a very special event around the subject of music in film. This event will feature three people from the film and music industry discussing the role of music in film, what it means to be a Music Supervisor, deal with clearing music so it can appear in a film and the role of a music representative who looks after artists and labels and how they get their music into film and television productions. The discussion will be followed by a screening of *The Who's Quadrophenia*.

Kirsten Lane is a Music Supervisor. She is founder of Right Music Ltd. She loves working with Directors, Writers and Producers to get the right music to tell their story to its maximum effect. She's worked on over 100 films across all genres including the films of Edgar Wright (from Shaun of the Dead through Baby Driver to the soon to be released The Running Man), Yesterday, the Bridget Jones films, the upcoming I Swear, Apex and Blood On Snow, as well as classics such as Legend, About Time, This is England, Love Actually and Saltburn - Murder on the Dancefloor anyone?

Music biopics include Control, Nowhere Boy, Bob Marley, Rocketman, Sex & Drugs & Rock n Roll. TV shows include The Gentleman, Brassic, Pistol, Red Riding Trilogy, The Ipcress Files & Upcoming The Young Sherlock Holmes.



Radiohead X Nosferatu (PG)

GER 1922. Dir F.W. Murnau. With Max Schreck & Radiohead - 90mins

F.W. Murnau's Nosferatu: A Symphony of Horror (1922), the original (and an unauthorized) film adaptation of Bram Stoker's Dracula, inspired an entire genre with its blood-thirsty, undead protagonist.

The mysterious Count Orlok summons estate agent Thomas Hutter to his remote Transylvanian castle in the mountains, seeking to buy a house near Hutter and his young wife, Ellen. After Orlok reveals his vampire nature, Hutter struggles to escape the castle, knowing that Ellen is in grave danger. Meanwhile Orlok's servant, Knock, prepares for his master to arrive at his new home.

This special presentation of Nosferatu: A Symphony of Horror (1922) pairs the original silent film with Radiohead's "KID A (2000) / Amnesiac (2001) as its score, courtesy of Silents Synced. Silents Synced pairs classic silent movies with epic rock music, partnering with independent cinemas to create memorable, new silent film experiences. "Nosferatu x Radiohead: A Silents Synced Film" is directed and remixed by Josh Frank.



John Cleese Packs it In (15)

UK 2025. Dir Andy Curd. With John Cleese - 90mins

One of the most recognisable figures in British comedy, John Cleese's career spans six decades - from his early days with the Cambridge Footlights to co-founding Monty Python, co-creating Fawlty Towers, and writing and starring in the Oscarnominated "A Fish Called Wanda". His unique brand of black humour has made him a global icon and intergalactic treasure.

At the age of eighty five, John Cleese sets off on what might be his final European tour - five countries, sixteen cities, twenty-three shows, and retaining just two original body parts. "John Cleese Packs It In" is a wry, behind-the-scenes portrait of a comedy legend on the road, battling various ailments, chaotic travel, and his own stubborn refusal to stop.

R.E.M. X Sherlock Jr. (U)

USA 1924. Dir Buster Keaton. With Buster Keaton and R.E.M. - 72mins

Silents Synced pairs classic silent movies with epic rock music to bring audiences a unique big screen experience. Buster Keaton's 1924 comedy classic is reimagined with R.E.M. 's alt-rock masterpieces Monster (1994) and New Adventures in Hi-Fi (1996).

In this sublime comedy teetering between reality and illusion, Buster Keaton stars as a film projectionist who dreams of becoming a detective. He uses his limited skills when he is framed by a rival for stealing his girlfriend's father's pocket watch. Keaton reportedly broke his neck performing one of the many dangerous practical stunts in the film.

A season of films showcasing the history of Technicolor filmmaking, taking us around the world to the far reaches of its influence.

From wartime Britain to a German school of dance run by witches and all the way to the Bengal River, all in beautiful vivid colours.

These films present important snapshots in time of these cultures and show off the incredible filmmaking of these lauded directors and their crews.

Technicolor changed the course of cinema forever with bright and bold visuals, saturated to the point of near-surreality.

Technicolor is a series of processes used to first produce colour in motion pictures. From 1916 to 1932, the Technicolor company tinkered with its system so that the process of colouring films became accessible to Hollywood. Today, Technicolor is perhaps more known for the end result of the colouring process than the process itself.

By the early 1930's, Technicolor developed a brand-new camera, which utilised a three-colour system (otherwise known as three strip Technicolor) rather than a two-colour system. And instead of recording only one negative, this new camera recorded three. Each of the three negatives were responsible for either red, blue, or green. Once Technicolor caught on with Filmmakers and audiences, it became the gold standard for film colourisation for several decades. Even with its efforts to provide the best possible colour imagery, though, Technicolor was no longer in demand as technological advances in filmmaking rendered it obsolete by the mid-1970s, but its influence and importance live on to this day.

IT 1977. Dir Dario Argento. With Jessica Harper, Eva Axen, Stefania Casini, Flavio Bucci - 97mins

A '70s Technicolour fever dream, Dario Argento's classic *Suspiria* marked a milestone in cinema with a near all-female cast. As Suzy (Jessica Harper) arrives at a ballet school in Germany, it quickly becomes clear it isn't what it seems as she encounters a woman frantically fleeing. Think *Black Swan* meets *Saint Maud* - this Halloween screening is not one to miss.

Suzy (Jessica Harper) travels to Germany to attend ballet school. When she arrives, late on a stormy night, no one lets her in, and she sees Pat (Eva Axén), another student, fleeing from the school. When Pat reaches her apartment, she is murdered. The next day, Suzy is admitted to her new school, but has a difficult time settling in. She hears noises, and often feels ill. As more people die, Suzy uncovers the terrifying secret history of the place.



General cinema entrance prices can be found at the front of the programme. Stage shows and live broadcast shows are priced individually. Please note pre-booked tickets for all our performances (including films) are non refundable. ID may be requested for 15 and 18 certificated films, and Student ID. There is a fee for purchasing tickets over the telephone, the Remote Booking Fee represents our charge for providing a convenient online and telephone booking service to our customers and is payable for all online and telephone bookings, irrespective of the method of payment. As the Remote Booking Fee only applies to bookings made online or by telephone, it can be avoided by purchasing tickets in person at the cinema. If you are an annual or six-monthly membership card holder then no booking fee is applicable online or via the telephone.

75p per ticket up to a maximum of £2.00, so if you purchase 4 tickets or more the total additional fee applicable would still be £2.00.

The fee allows a customer to secure a seat of their choice in advance, helps to cover the cost of our website, web hosting fees, our ticket provider costs, the processing of the payment and necessary administration to secure your advance booking.

AUDIO DESCRIPTION SERVICE

Cinema audio description is a fantastic service for people with sight loss. The normal film soundtrack comes through the cinema's surround sound speakers in the usual way, whilst a recorded narrator explains what's happening on screen – in gaps in the dialogue – through personal headphones. Most popular cinema releases are now available with audio description tracks.

Just ask for an A.D. headset at the box office. The audio description is broadcast through personal headphones – only the wearer hears it.

We also offer a hearing loop system for our customers with impaired hearing. A hearing loop sends sound from a source straight to hearing aids on the hearing loop setting (this used to be called the T' setting). Most hearing aids have a hearing loop setting.

CEA CARD

The CEA Card is a national card scheme developed for UK cinemas by the UK Cinema Association (UKCA). The Card enables a disabled cinema guest to receive a complimentary ticket for someone to go with them when they visit a participating cinema.
